



SOCIAL MEDIA, VIOLENCE, & TRAFFICKING

The significant youth presence on social media platforms gives traffickers many points of access to recruit. Where traffickers would otherwise have to interact with youth in person to recruit them, social media provides easy, discreet, and consistent access to youth. Traffickers may exploit youth's desire for meaningful online friendships and relationships.

RED FLAGS

- Using multiple phones
- Sudden spikes in social media activity
- Excessively preoccupied with online image
- Tagged in other people's photos that depict them in sexually explicit ways
- Frequently uses tags to advertise location
- Suddenly deletes, unfollows, or blocks friends

Attachment to social media can be typical of youth. Focus on patterns of use and behaviors associated with use.

RECRUITING YOUTH

- Contact via private or public messages or tag them in photos
- Contact on a dating app
- Advertise jobs
- Provide cell phones for access to social media
- Pose as a romantic partner, friend, or job recruiter
- Force potential victims of trafficking to recruit others
- Use privacy settings to avoid or prevent notice
